

Read and Write Numbers in Words

How to use: Print first for the main practice. Then use the device to repeat activities and save progress.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- 1 Read and write two-digit numbers in word form and read
- 2 Write three-digit numbers in word form
- 3 Use a hyphen correctly in compound numbers (e.g., forty-three)
- 4 Skip the tens word when the tens digit is zero (e.g., nine hundred seven)

MINI LESSON

Every number you can write with digits also has a name made of words — just like your name has letters!

Teen numbers (13-19)

- These have a special "-teen" ending: thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen.
- Example: $16 =$ sixteen.
- Watch out! $11 =$ eleven and $12 =$ twelve — they don't follow the -teen pattern.

Tens and compound numbers (20-99)

- Tens words: twenty, thirty, forty, fifty, sixty, seventy, eighty, ninety.
- Numbers that are not exact tens use a hyphen: forty-three, sixty-seven, ninety-one.
- Even numbers like 50 or 80 are just the tens word alone: fifty, eighty.

Three-digit numbers (100-999)

- Say the hundreds digit first: "three hundred," "seven hundred."
- Then say the rest of the number normally: $315 =$ three hundred fifteen.
- If the tens place is zero, skip it: $907 =$ nine hundred seven.

247 in words

247

2 hundreds
two hundred

4 tens
forty

7 ones
seven

word form:

two hundred forty-seven

Hyphen joins forty + seven!

907 in words

907

9 hundreds
nine hundred

~~0 tens~~
~~skip!~~

7 ones
seven

word form:

nine hundred seven

Zero tens? Skip it - no word needed!

! Ask yourself: "Do I start with hundreds? Do I need a hyphen between tens and ones?"

PARENT / TEACHER CHECKLIST

- Writes the correct word form of any two-digit number on the paper worksheet without prompting.

- Writes the correct word form of a three-digit number, stating hundreds first and then the rest.
- Correctly skips the tens word when the tens digit is zero (e.g., writes "nine hundred seven," not "nine hundred zero seven").
